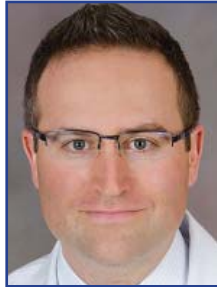

### CALL FOR RESEARCH CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROPOSALS

Letters of Intent due December 1, 2018 · Applications due January 31, 2019

These awards provide support for the research career development of young otolaryngologist-head and neck surgeons. Projects must have a direct impact on the applicant's ability to pursue his/her long range research objectives. These awards will provide funding of \$40,000 for a period of 12-24 months (non-renewable). Projects may focus on clinical research, basic research, health services and outcomes research, technology/procedure development, otolaryngology status and trends, and historical perspectives.
