These awards provide funding of \$40,000 for a period of 12-24 months (non-renewable) and are given based upon the number of meritorious applications received. Projects may focus on clinical research, basic research, health services and outcomes research, technology procedure development, otolaryngology status and trends, and historical perspectives.
